Our plan is to make accommodations where we can with the primary goal of optimizing health, safety and student learning.

In the next few weeks we will craft our fall plans, order supplies and decide on the factors that may cause us to shift. Given the nature of public opinion, please know we are navigating uncharted waters and will do our best to make choices in the best interests of our students, staff, parents and community. We are running a parent/community survey to better understand the concerns you hold and take them into account when we make plans. A link to that survey will be on the homepage of the district website. Some paper copies will be available in the office or you can call us to mail them to you. The survey window will open on Monday 7/27 and run until the end of the day on Monday August 3rd. A summary will be shared in the following weeks Tribune and on our website. We will also hold a School Board Workshop style meeting to discuss the school committee's progress on fall planning.
