I did require my boys to be in sport every season, maintain at least a 3.2 GPA, take the college bound courses in high school, work a full time job every summer, etc. In school I wanted my boys to show respect to every teacher, do all their homework, be on the honor roll, eat properly and exercise to keep in shape, and be a responsible, humble citizen.

We seem to have lost some of the values, respect, morals, responsibility, caring, etc. that were required in my days in school. Many students do not respect the teachers who spend many hours preparing students to enter college or the workforce. We need students who are strong and stand up to peer pressure and do what's right. Many people feel that the world owes them something instead of having to work for their paycheck or advancement. We need a workforce that shows pride in their work and wants to provide the American public a good product.

As parents we need to have our children do right! It is not easy but it is a requirement of a parent. You want your children to be responsible adults when they grow up?
